



This saga by the Old Sage is reprinted with the kind permission of the Antique Motorcycle Club of America. We thank them for allowing us to reprint these stories, because many of our Chapter members have never had a chance to read these entertaining articles

Bud Cox was one of the founding members of the Sunflower Chapter and an Honorary Member of the AMCA. He penned the "Old Sage" articles for more than thirteen years, with the first episode appearing in the 1994 Winter issue of the AMCA magazine. This "Old Sage" episode originally appeared in the 2002 Fall issue of "The Antique Motorcycle"

The first Sunflower edition to reprint "the Old Sage" was in November 2010, Bob Christian was editor. Shortly thereafter Bill Gordon took over as editor and continued. Bill handed the reins to me with about 35 photocopied articles along with a catalog of when he reprinted them. I started downloading the articles off the AMCA archives when Bills' material ran out. I discovered this 2002 issue missing from Bills inventory. I downloaded it and found this caricature in the original article and was not used in any other article. Enjoy this, exactly as it appeared then.



Several years back, the Wichita group known as the "Rugged Riders of the Dirty Thirties" were in Colorado. Our fearless leader, named "Herb", was leading us up Mt. Evans. Jerry and I had pulled out ahead of the group and were having a fine time racing up the twisting, winding road. Jerry was riding an A.J.S. single, and I was on a strong Sport Scout. We pulled over and waited for our group to catch up. A nice lady in a big car stopped and asked if we were part of the group that was behind us. She said that we should know that one of the riders went "over the side." We almost went into "panic" mode. Jerry's dad, son, and my two sons were in the group, as well as several friends. We *really* went back down the mountain.

As we arrived, the fellows were just pulling Herb up on to the road. We checked him over pretty good and noticed that he was not bleeding anywhere. This was good news because any amount of bleeding can really mess up your clothes. It seems that Herb had hit a huge pothole that bounced him clear off the seat and over the edge. 
